Topic / Unit of Study Native American Language / Endangered Languages

Objective Students will be able to:

Implementation

Materials • Playground linguistic panel

· Access to online research resources

Instruction

- 1. Assess prior knowledge by asking students why languages are important to a culture.
- 2. Ask students if they can name any Native American tribes and which were native to the local area.
- 3. Discuss the concept of a endangered language and the reason that many indigenous languages are endangered. Explain the importance of keeping Native languages alive and preserving culture.
- 4. Gather around the playground linguistic panel.
- 5. Explain that some languages are not written, and symbols can be used in place of written language.
- 6. Guide students in pronouncing the vocabulary words on the linguistic panel. Discuss why the terms depicted would be important for communication among Native tribes.
- 7. Return to the classroom. Divide students into small groups and assign a Native language to research.
- 8. Guide students to research 4-5 words in their assigned language that would be important for daily communication. Use the <u>Indigenous Language Research Guide</u> for assistance.
- 9. Ask each student to present their findings to the class.

Assessment

- 1. Students will work collaboratively, with guidance, to research indigenous languages.
- 2. Students will verbalize the concept of a endangered language and why it is important to keep indigenous languages alive.
- 3. Students will present their findings to the class in a clear, coherent manner.
